Nominations Content

Nominations for the 2010 Awards should be submitted electronically to the respective chairs listed below or to the ACM Awards Committee Liaison, Rosemary McGuinness (mcguinness@acm.org).

As a general rule, each nomination submitted should consist of at least the following items:

1. Name, address, and phone number of person making the nomination.
2. Name and address of candidate for whom an award is recommended.
3. A statement (between 200 and 500 words long) as to why the candidate deserves the particular award.
4. Supporting letters from a minimum of two endorsers.
5. For the Turing Award a minimum of three endorsement letters should be provided. Successful Turing Award nominations usually include substantive letters of support from a group of prominent individuals broadly representative of the candidate's field.
6. For the Karl V. Karlstrom Outstanding Educator Award, a CV and listing of the candidate's Ph.D. students and their current positions are requested. It would be helpful to include the candidate's CV for all other award nominations.

ACM - Infosys Foundation Award

Nominations Solicited

Nominations are invited for the 2010 ACM – Infosys Foundation Award. The ACM – Infosys Foundation Award in the Computing Sciences recognizes personal contributions by young scientists and system developers to a contemporary innovation that, through its depth, fundamental impact and broad implications, exemplifies the greatest achievements in the discipline. The award is accompanied by a prize of \$150,000. Financial support for the award is provided by an endowment from the Infosys Foundation.

Nominations should include:

1. A current vitae, listing the age of the candidate, publications, patents, honors other awards, etc.
2. A nomination letter from the principal nominator, which describes the work of the nominee, and draws particular attention to the contributions which are seen as meriting the award.
3. Short supporting letters from at least three, and no more than five, endorsers. The letters should come from prominent individuals familiar with the nominee's contributions and no more than two from the same institution.
4. A short citation of 25 words or less should be included in the nomination.
