UNE Art Gallery Exhibit

Images in Black and White - the photography of Peter Michelena and Dirk McDonnell opened at the UNE Art Gallery, WCC on November 6 Photographers Peter Michelena and Dirk McDonnell, both from Camden, Maine, possess two differing, yet complementary approaches to the photographic image.

Michelena, with a background in design, creates work with strong graphic elements found in the urban landscape with its potential for textures, patterns, light and shadows. After years of photographing worldwide, McDonnell has concentrated lately on the winter landscape in Maine. A gallery talk with Dirk McDonnell will take place on December 11th from 5:00 - 6:30 p.m. Admission and programs are free. UC Art Exhibits

Two separate art exhibits are on display through January 3, 2004 on the UC.

In the Campus Center Gallery are drawings and paintings by Donna Oehmig. Titled "Personal Geometry," the exhibit "represents the expression of a current of energy I experience and am exploring in myself through the language of color and drawing. Music, sacred geometry, rhythm, periodicity and my own inner voice inspire the work," according to the artist. Oehmig has studied graphic design and painting, earning at B.F.A. from the Maine College of Art in 1993. She has had wide exposure with solo exhibitions in southern Maine and has shown at numerous selected group and juried exhibitions. Both her graphic design and fine art have received awards, including the Special Judge's Award by the Art Guild of the Kennebunks in 2003. Oehmig has taught at the River Tree Center for the Arts and Heartwood School of Art. The Campus Center Gallery is open 8 a.m. - 6 p.m. daily.

An eclectic show of works by Maine calligraphers is in the Stella Maris Gallery. Eleven artists from around the state integrate their calligraphy with a wide and creative use of other visual media. The artists are Ilene Berman, Rick Bouchard, Carolyn Carter, Margo

Dittmer, Liliane Kell, Nancy Ruth Leavitt, LeeAnne Mallonee, Erica McPhee, Maggie McNeice, William Miller and Beth Sandmire. The Stella Maris Gallery is open 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
